Message from the Chair of the Board

THEODORA KONETSOVSKA

Dear Giving Report readers,

You may not know that when ACS first reopened in 1992, the cost of education for the first class of students was almost fully covered by donations and investment returns accumulated during the College's closure from 1942 to 1992. At ACS's reopening, many of the students admitted to the 1992 class (me included) could only attend thanks to the partial or full tuition subsidy. At the same time, most donors from those 50 years ago were no longer around to witness their impact. This deeply hopeful and life-altering inter-generational gift of education is one of the greatest lessons I learned at ACS.



Since 1992, many parents, teachers, trustees, alumni, and friends near and far have continued the tradition of educational gift-giving by contributing annually to support the College. Our operations would not be possible without our donors. One such donor family has been providing full scholarships to ACS students for more than 20 years - Nellie and Bob Gipson. (Bob celebrated a big birthday during SY24-25, so giving him a "shout-out" in this year's Giving Report feels just right.)

Bob Gipson, a life-long New Yorker, and his wife Nellie Gipson, born in Bulgaria and a close partner of ACS since 1992, began providing full scholarships to ACS students with demonstrated financial need in the early 2000's. At ACS, they established scholarships to honor Ambassador Sol Polansky and Mrs. Polansky, and Joseph Oberbauer (individuals not born in Bulgaria with life-long contributions to Bulgarian education and society). In addition, the Gipsons also support a host of other educational, cultural, and research activities throughout Bulgaria.

To give a young person access to quality education is a life-changing gift. In the case of the Gipson, Polansky and Oberbauer scholarship recipients, following excellent careers at the College, these ACS students have garnered successes in a broad range of academic and professional fields globally. Bob often says that education is his family's biggest, lifelong commitment as "payback" for access to quality education he had as a young person. Making access to good education available to all has proven, throughout history and worldwide, to be the great "opportunity equalizer" and a cornerstone of democracy. And supporting education is available to all, in any amount and any chosen format.

I know that Nellie and Bob will continue to inspire alumni to make education one of their personal philanthropic and service priorities. A growing number of our alumni are setting up their own ACS scholarships to support the next generations of students, such as the Sunrise and the Mittenhal Scholarships, most recently. Whatever amount we choose to donate toward education, it is an amount well spent. Education remains the most effective, egalitarian tool to influence the world long after we are gone, and to trust we are influencing it for the better. Just as did the benefactors from the period of ACS's closure up to this day.

The culmination of their efforts will be celebrated in May, just as those classes that preceded them were celebrated.

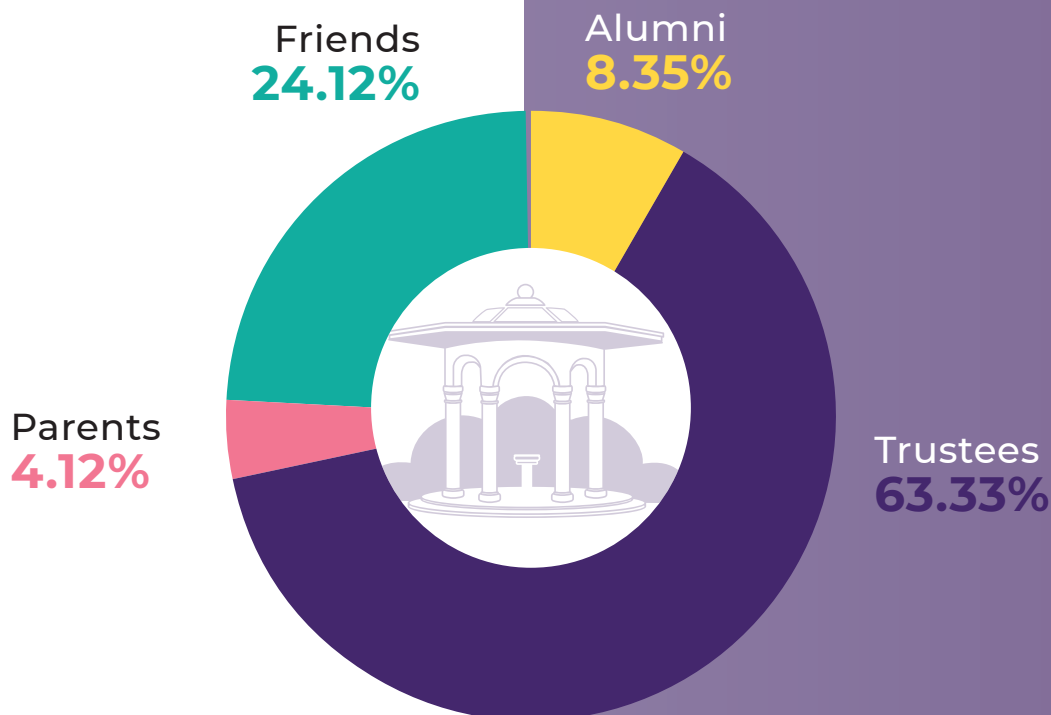

Arts Fest

Attendees enjoyed live performances, club stands, and interactive activities. America for Bulgaria Scholarship Program

In partnership with the America for Bulgaria Foundation, ACS continues to provide full financial support, including tuition and dormitory accommodation, to displaced Ukrainian students. These students are fully integrated into academic and extracurricular life, contributing diverse perspectives and talents to the ACS community. The program reflects our shared commitment to inclusivity, compassion, and educational opportunity amid global challenges. Their presence enriches classroom discussions, strengthens peer connections, and inspires the entire community to embrace resilience and empathy.



Tennis Court Renovation

The renovation of the tennis and volleyball court was made possible through the generosity of the ACS Parent Ambassadors, led by Dmitry Isachenko and Vania Cenkova. The project has provided students with an upgraded space for athletic and recreational activities, fostering teamwork and well-being. This initiative exemplifies the community's ability to translate vision into tangible improvements that enhance student experiences. The new facilities will create opportunities for hosting events and competitions that further engage students and strengthen school spirit.



Student Activities Fund (SAF)

The Student Activities Fund supports student-led initiatives that foster innovation, leadership, and community impact. This year's SAF live-pitch session featured projects across academic, artistic, and community-focused initiatives, including FISSION International Science Fair, SofiaTalks Business, Model United Nations Conference, Career Fair, Music Jam, TEDxYouth@ACS, FIRST Robotics Competition, and Green Committee. Established in 2014 by ACS alumni, SAF provides financial support, guidance, and mentoring, empowering students to translate ideas into meaningful actions both on campus and beyond.



Ss. Cyril and Methodius Scholarship

The Ss. Cyril and Methodius Scholarship, established by the Domuschiev Impact Foundation, covers full tuition for five Bulgarian students in the Class of 2030 for the duration of their five-year ACS education. The program prioritizes students from single parent or guardian households and demonstrated significant

We continue her mission today through the Inez Abbott Giving Circle with scholarships for young women from outside Sofia to ensure that financial barriers do not stand in the way of their academic and personal growth. Our priority is to provide partial yearly scholarships that “fill the gap”, enabling students whose families encounter financial shortfalls to continue their studies uninterrupted.

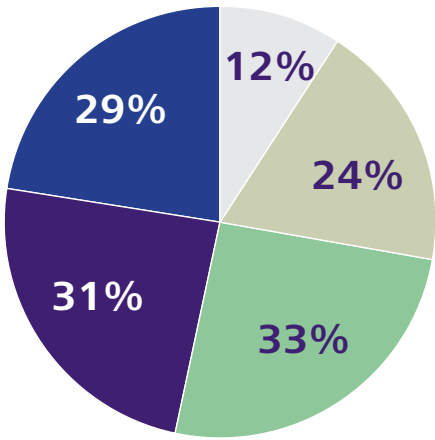

Sofia, originally from Plovdiv, loves Robotics and is exploring universities in the UK and US where she may pursue a major in engineering.

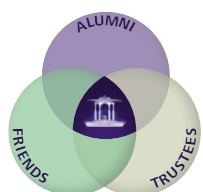
Nora, originally from Varna, has just enrolled in her freshman year at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee.

I want to express my gratitude for the scholarship you provided – words cannot describe how grateful I am! It gave me much needed support when my family was struggling financially and was my motivation to keep working hard on myself and my studies!

This scholarship has given me the opportunity to open myself to the world and to new experiences I hadn't even imagined before. I discovered my passion for singing and performing, which led me to some of the big Bulgarian stages like Hall 1 of the National Palace of Culture, international projects and charity events. I also discovered my affinity for diplomatic relations – this led me to Geneva and the Yale Model UN conference this year. This scholarship showed me a new world of opportunities I'll forever be grateful for.

ACS changed my life entirely. I met so many new people, found new hobbies and learned new life lessons. I got to be the student of many passionate teachers, who not only taught us a subject, but also prepared us for the future.

ACS was a transformative experience for me. It gave me a worldview and taught me to approach things in a way that has been of enormous help to me and both my professional and personal growth. It taught me that you can do everything if you just try and keep learning along the way. Something which, although it might sound simple, is something which a lot of my peers from other schools don't have. ACS is one of the most impactful things that have happened to me and would not be possible for me without the scholarship.

The scholarship was a powerful vote of confidence and an example of what it means to recognize promise in a student and choose to invest in it. 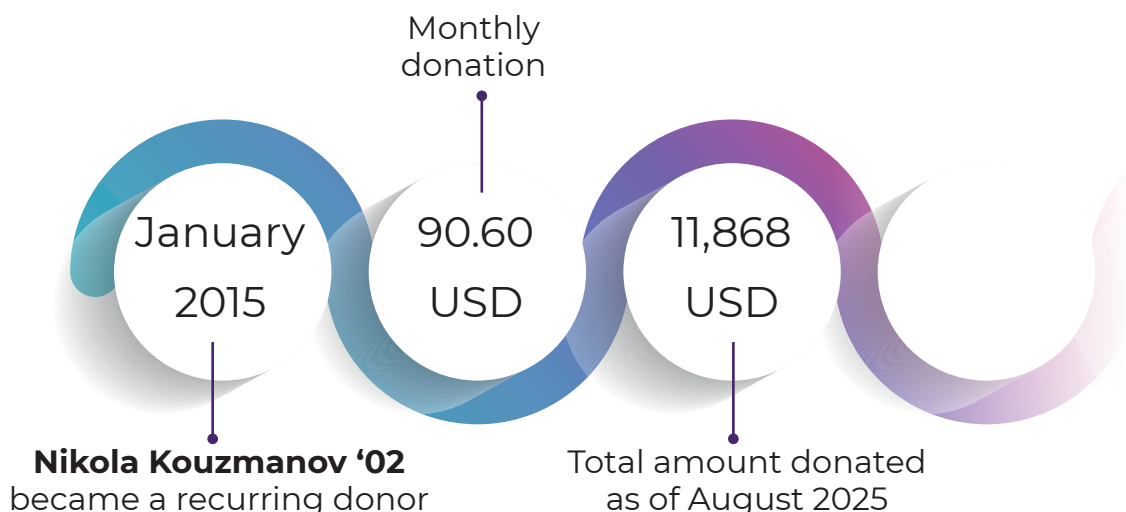


RECURRING DONORS

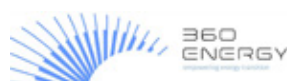

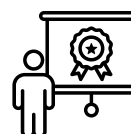

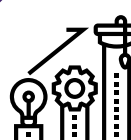
